Greiner] Provides a class B misdemeanor for a person to fail to disclose the person's name when disclosure is demanded by a peace officer after the peace officer stops the person based on a reasonable suspicion that the person has committed, is in the act of committing, or is attempting to commit, a criminal offense, and provides certain exceptions. Provides that a peace officer may, without a warrant, arrest a person for failure to disclose identity if the peace officer has reasonable cause to believe that the person committed the offense of failure to disclose identity. [FN: Enactment of this bill will not require additional appropriation.] (NEW class B.)</p>

[FN: Enactment of this bill will not require additional appropriation.]</p>

<p>HB0012</p>	<p>offense of production or distribution of a controlled substance is considered to be a conviction for sentencing enhancement purposes. Amends language regarding items used to ingest or inhale controlled substances so the language refers to all controlled substances, rather than specifically marijuana, cocaine, and hashish. Clarifies that a person may be charged for an illegal drug or paraphernalia offense and may also be charged for a violation of any other section of the Controlled Substances Act or the Drug Paraphernalia Act. [FN: Will not require additional appropriations.]</p>

Dayton] Provides that prosecution of a person for any first degree felony sex offense may be commenced at any time. [FN: Enactment of this bill will not require additional appropriations.]</p>
<p>HB0014</p>	<p>Discharge of Firearm Amendments CCJJ USC USAAV LELC UCV UBJJ (Sponsor: Carl Wimmer Party: R) SUP SUP SUP SUP SUP SUP [GOVERNOR SIGNED 3.18.08] [Sen. Madsen] Provides that having the permission of the person in charge of the property when discharging a firearm is only a defense to a misdemeanor offense of discharging a firearm, not a felony offense. Modifies provisions relating to felony discharge of a firearm by describing conduct that constitutes a first, second, or third degree felony and describing enhanced penalties for these offenses. Describes circumstances under which discharge of a dangerous weapon or a firearm from a vehicle is not a crime. [FN: Enactment of this bill will not require additional appropriation.] (INC third degree felony to second for bodily injury; INC second degree felony to first for serious bodily injury.)</p>

Peterson] Amends the intent of a person dealing with material harmful to minors to include persons who believe the victim is a minor. Modifies the definition of "restrict" regarding access to material harmful to minors by removing "age verification mechanism" as a form of restriction. Removes certain criminal penalties, imposes the standard of intentionally and knowingly, and imposes civil financial penalties regarding failure to comply with requirements that Internet providers (1) provide information about filtering content; and (2) restrict access to material harmful to minors. [FN: Enactment of this bill will not require additional appropriations.]</p>

Provides that the section amended in this bill does not affect the exercise of constitutional rights, including the right of free speech and the right of assembly. Provides a definition of "peace officer" to mean a law enforcement officer certified under Section 53-13-103. (INC class A to third degree felony.) (DOC one new admission to prison each year.)</p>

Provides that a person who commits child abandonment, or encourages or causes another to commit child abandonment, or an enterprise that encourages, commands, or causes another to commit child abandonment is a third degree felony; or if the child abandonment results in serious physical injury to the child, or the person or enterprise receives any benefit as a result of the child abandonment, it is a second degree felony. Provides that a court may order a person or enterprise to pay the costs of investigating and prosecuting a child abandonment case and the costs of securing a forfeiture provided for in this bill. Provides that tangible or pecuniary benefits received from child abandonment are subject to criminal or civil forfeiture. [FN: Enactment of this bill will not require additional appropriations. Jenkins] Defines "online identifier" to mean any electronic mail, chat, instant messenger, social networking, or similar name used for Internet communication. It does not include date of birth, SSN, or PIN numbers. Requires that a sex offender also provide online identifiers when registering as required by law. Requires that sex offenders provide websites on which they are registered with online identifiers. Requires the sex offender to provide passwords to the department for certain electronic sites, but prohibits the passwords from being provided to the public. [FN: Enactment of this bill will not require additional appropriations. Enactment of this bill likely will not result in direct, measurable costs and/or benefits for individuals, businesses, or local governments.]</p>

Walker] Directs the Div. of Substance Abuse and Mental Health (SAMH), within the Dept. of Human Services, to conduct a public education and outreach program to inform pregnant women, and women who may become pregnant, of the risk of using substances that are harmful during pregnancy, of treatment available to avoid or stop the use of these substances, and legal protections pertaining to this treatment. [FN: Enactment of this bill will require a one-time appropriation of \$40,000 and an ongoing of \$31,200 for a total of \$71,200 from the Gen.</p>

Walker] Provides that a child-placing agency has a direct, tangible, and legitimate interest in the vital records of a child that has been placed with the agency pending finalization of an adoption. Modifies and clarifies the definition of "adoption related expenses" that a person may pay or accept without committing the crime of "sale of a child." Amends the offense of "sale of a child" to make it a third degree felony to offer to sell or dispose of a child, or to give, or attempt to give, money or another thing of value to a person with the intent to induce the person to sell or dispose of a child. Makes incarceration for a felony a factor that a court must consider in determining whether a parent is unfit or has neglected a child, regardless of whether the child is in the custody of the Division of Child and Family Services. Modifies requirements relating to taking consents and relinquishments for adoption. Clarifies which code provisions must be complied with in order for a court to waive the requirement that adoptive parents and the child to be adopted appear before the court prior to entry of a final decree of adoption. Provides for staffing of the unit and provides that the primary purpose of the unit is to investigate, apprehend, and prosecute individuals and entities that make, use, or distribute fraudulent documents used for identity purposes. Clarifies that the mental states referred to in the offense of child abuse homicide are only applicable to the element of the commission of child abuse, not to the element of causing the death of a child. Increases the penalties for child abuse homicide from a second to a first degree felony if the child abuse is done recklessly; increases child abuse homicide from a third to a second degree felony if the child abuse is done with criminal negligence and under circumstances not amounting to the type of child abuse homicide that is done recklessly. Requires that the assessment is to be administered (1) not less than every 16 weeks during the first year the offender is supervised in the community; and (2) not less than every 26 weeks nor more than every 12 weeks as determined to be appropriate by the department's supervisory personnel and the sex offender's treatment team, during the second year the offender is supervised in the community and continuing until termination of the offender's probation or parole. Funds of \$16,000 in FY2011 and each year thereafter.] (NEW third degree felony.)</p>

Establishes a pilot program, beginning July 1, 2008 and ending on December 1, 2010, for the real-time reporting of, and access to, controlled substance database information by pharmacies, pharmaceutical facilities, and physicians. Grants rulemaking authority to the DOPL in relation to the pilot program. Requires DOPL to report on the pilot program and the advisability and cost of implementing the pilot program on a statewide basis. Requires an operator of a school bus to turn off the bus or vehicle engine upon stopping at a school or from turning a school bus on more than two minutes before departing or idling within certain locations for more than a certain period of time. Provides a class C misdemeanor for violating the bus operation or idling restrictions and an additional civil penalty of \$100. (NEW class C misdemeanor.)</p>

Peterson] [AMEND] Provides that it is a class A misdemeanor for any sex offender whose offense was against a child to request or allow a child younger than 14 to accompany the sex offender for any purpose unless: (1) the sex offender has in the sex offender's possession written permission from the child's parent or guardian authorizing the offender to accompany the child; (2) the child's parent or guardian has given verbal permission and both the child and the sex offender are in the child's home or on the property appurtenant to the child's home; or (3) the child is the natural child of the sex offender, and the offender is not prohibited by any court order, or probation or parole provision, from contact with the child.
