<b>Bill Title/Subject Matter:</b>	<b>Statute of Limitations on Bad Checks</b>

Code Reference:	Amends UCA §70A-3-118 and §78B-2-309
<p><b>Description:</b> Clarifies that the statute of limitations on a dishonored check is the earliest of: six years after the dishonor of the check; or 10 years after the date of the draft, whichever period expires first.</p> <p>The legislation was not passed out of committee due to the absence of a quorum.</p>

Code Reference:	Amends UCA §31A-22-613, §31A-22-619, and §64-13-30
<p>Provides that, if an insured is otherwise eligible for benefits under a policy, an accident and health insurer may not exclude coverage for an insured who: is an inmate housed in a correctional facility; or is an offender in the custody of the Department of Corrections. Requires that an accident and health insurer coordinate benefits for an insured who is: an inmate housed in a correctional facility; or an offender in the custody of the Department of Corrections. Requires an inmate who has medical or dental insurance coverage, upon entering in the Department of Correction’s custody, to use that coverage as primary payer for medical and dental costs incurred while in the custody of the Department of Corrections. Provides specified exemptions regarding coverage by an inmate’s health or dental insurance policy, including injuries to the insured caused by physical violence.</p> <p>Passed out with a favorable recommendation.</p>
