UTAH DRUG COURTS:

**An inventory of judicially monitored, substance abuse
treatment programs**

September 27, 2001

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I. Introduction

Drug courts show promise as an effective tool to combat substance abuse and crime. These programs integrate judicial system case processing with substance abuse treatment. There is good reason for this linkage. In Utah, nearly 75% of inmates in correctional institutions are drug or alcohol involved.¹ 60% of participants in substance abuse treatment programs are referred by the criminal justice system.²

Drug courts are based on an understanding that substance abuse is a chronic, progressive, relapsing disorder that can be successfully treated. They operate on the premise that the post arrest period provides a good opportunity for intervention aimed at breaking the drug-crime cycle. Nationally, there is a large body of research that suggests drug courts reduce substance abuse and decrease recidivism.³

Twenty-one drug court programs are operating in Utah. At least five courts are currently engaged in the planning process. Three courts have completed a formal planning process and are attempting to secure implementation funds. Every judicial district has at least one drug court. Close to 1000 Utahans are actively participating in substance abuse treatment provided by a drug court program. In the last five years, almost 2500 participants have received services from these programs.

Research on Utah drug courts is limited. To date, only three independent evaluations have been completed.⁴ The existing research focuses on recidivism and does not address cost effectiveness or cost savings. To rectify this situation, the Utah State Legislature asked the Division of Substance Abuse (DSA) and the Commission on Criminal and Juvenile Justice (CCJJ) to spearhead drug court research that examines cost effectiveness, evaluates treatment availability, and identifies best practices.⁵

As a first step in addressing the Legislature's request, DSA and CCJJ decided to create an "inventory" of drug courts in Utah. Specifically, this report attempts to provide a snapshot of each program's treatment, case management, drug testing, and judicial component. The intent of this report is to provide researchers with an understanding of the similarities and differences of Utah drug courts.

Drug courts vary in their structure and approach to substance abuse treatment and supervision. Some programs target first time offenders. Others make previous drug



convictions an eligibility requirement in an attempt to target hardcore addicts. Most programs offer a plea in abeyance to participants. Other programs work with probation or parole populations. Participants in misdemeanor programs usually abuse marijuana or alcohol. Felony program participants are most likely methamphetamine, cocaine or heroin addicts. Drug courts treatment varies in length and in programming. The sanctions for noncompliance and the rewards or incentives vary from court to court. Researchers need to aware of and consider all of these differences before reaching any conclusions about the impact of drug courts.



III Adult Felony Drug Courts

There are eight district-level adult felony drug courts operating in the State of Utah. The first felony drug court was started in the Third District in 1996. Three courts are in the planning stages. Most of these programs target opiate, cocaine or methamphetamine users with previous convictions for drug related crimes. However, two felony drug courts target first time felony offenders. Most participants enter the felony drug courts on a plea in abeyance. Some courts also include probationers or parolees in the mix. All of the felony drug courts require participants to submit to frequent drug tests. All of the felony drug courts use the Addiction Severity Index to assess offenders and provide access to a full continuum of treatment and rehabilitation services.

Adult Misdemeanor Drug Courts

Three Justice Court-level drug courts provide non-violent misdemeanor offenders with the opportunity to participate in judicially supervised, substance abuse treatment. Most of the participants in the misdemeanor courts have been arrested on marijuana or alcohol charges. These courts usually target first time offenders. Generally, misdemeanor drug court treatment programs are shorter than felony drug courts. All three of the programs operating in Utah are designed to last six months.

None of the Misdemeanor drug courts have received federal or state drug court funding. Judges donate time and resources to make these programs a reality. Local governmental agencies provide case management and treatment without federal or state assistance. The Misdemeanor drug courts are truly a grass roots response to the cycle of substance abuse and crime that has impacted local communities.







V. Juvenile Drug Court

Juvenile drug courts are designed for drug offenders in need of substance abuse treatment. The juvenile courts have been very supportive of the drug court model and were the first to establish a drug court in Utah. Four juvenile drug courts are currently operating. One juvenile court has completed a planning process and is now attempting to secure implementation funds

Juvenile courts involve parents and the schools in the creation of the treatment plan. Case managers conduct home and school visits. Generally, juvenile programs are shorter in duration than adult felony courts.

VI Dependency Drug Court

Dependency drug courts focus on adults who have temporarily lost custody of their children due to substance abuse or neglect. The process uses a team approach to hold parents accountable for their behavior, to monitor treatment, and to keep a focus on recovery with the goal of reuniting the family. When reunification is not possible, the drug court process enables the children to more rapidly obtain a permanent placement. The dependency drug court holds group hearings, a process that is in contrast to the standard abuse/neglect proceedings that are closed.

There are three dependency drug courts in Utah. Weber County, Salt Lake County and Utah County are currently operating dependency drug courts. The Utah County / Fourth District Dependency Drug Court was the first to start operating in Utah.

VII Re-Entry or Parole Drug Courts

Re-entry courts are designed to reintegrate drug-addicted prisoners into the community. The Davis /Weber Drug Board is the only re-entry court in Utah. Parolees from the State prison system in need of substance abuse treatment are released to the supervision of the Drug Board Program. Also, parolees who are in jeopardy of returning to prison due to substance abuse are eligible for this program.

A hearing officer from the Board of Pardons plays the role of the drug court judge. Participants appear before the hearing officer who has the authority to impose sanctions or reward participants for compliance. Participants are required to participate in a substance abuse treatment and submit to random urinalysis. Adult Probation Parole conducts home visits and provides case management services.





VIII Dual-Model Drug Courts

Dual-model drug courts are a combination of all of the different models operating in Utah. For instance, the Emery County Drug Court includes participants who are charged with felony drug crimes as well as parents involved in a custody case with the State. Juveniles may also participate. Dual-model courts seem to be an effective approach for rural areas where the small population and limited resources makes operating separate programs for each of these populations infeasible.


