GOV SIGNED AMENDED Changes the offense of unlawful sexual conduct with a minor who is 16 or 17 years of age to provide that the offense applies to a defendant who knowingly, intentionally, or recklessly commits specific sexual acts with the minor and the defendant is seven or more years older, but fewer than 10 years older than the victim. Modifies the provision regarding mistake regarding victim's age to provide that it is not a defense to the crime of unlawful sexual conduct with a minor who is 16 or 17 years of age, that the actor mistakenly believed the victim to be 18 years of age or older at the time of the alleged offense, if the actor is 10 or more years older than the victim. PROVIDES for an immediate effective date. [FN: will result in ongoing court, incarceration, and supervision costs of \$62,400 in FY2014 and \$122,400 in FY2015 from the Gen Fund. Costs will increase each year until FY2018 when ongoing costs from the Gen Fund will be \$219,900. Gen Fund revenue collections from criminal penalties will be approximately \$1,000 annually for a net Gen Fund cost of \$61,400 in FY2014 and \$121,400 in FY2015. An estimated 6 offenders per year will be jailed for about 17 days each for a total cost to county jails of \$6,500 annually. An average of 2 offenders annually will pay \$500 in penalties for a total of \$1,000 ongoing Gen Fund revenue.]

GOV SIGNED AMENDED Defines smoking; prohibits a person from smoking in a motor vehicle if a child who is 15 years of age or younger except in CERTAIN circumstances (if convertible or open-body type motor vehicle and roof is in the open-air mode) is a passenger in the vehicle. Provides that violating the smoking prohibition is an infraction and has a maximum fine of \$45. Provides that until July 1, 2014, a peace officer may not issue a citation to an individual for a violation of this section but shall issue the individual a warning informing the individual that smoking is prohibited in a motor vehicle if a child who is 15 years of age or younger is a passenger in the vehicle. Provides that a court may suspend the fine for a violation if the person has not previously been convicted of smoking in a vehicle when a child is present and proves that the person has enrolled in a smoking cessation program. Provides that enforcement of the smoking prohibition shall be only as a secondary action. Provides that a violation of the smoking prohibition may not be used as a basis for or evidence of child abuse or

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neglect. [FN: Beginning FY2015 enforcement through the courts will cost about \$6,600 in ongoing Gen. Fund that will be off-set by annual Gen. Fund revenue of \$5,000 from fines for a net annual impact of \$1,600. Local Justice Courts may incur additional costs and/or associated revenue.] (NEW infraction penalty)

GOV SIGNED Standardizes language that establishes certain criminal penalties in Title 20A, Election Code. Repeals provisions that specify who is required to prosecute a violation of Title 20A, Election Code. [FN: Will not materially impact the state budget.]

GOV SIGNED AMENDED Requires the Utah Department of Corrections to provide a document of gift form at an inmate's request, indicating an inmate's desire to make an anatomical gift if the inmate dies while in the custody of the department. Requires the department to maintain a record of an inmate's anatomical gift determination. Provides that the department may release to an organ procurement organization the names of all inmates who indicate they intend to make an anatomical gift. THE DEPARTMENT shall not be considered to be an inmate's guardian for purposes of Title 26. [FN: Will not materially impact the state budget.]

GOV SIGNED AMENDED Provides that threatening to commit an act of terrorism with the intent to cause action by an official or volunteer of any emergency agency is a class B misdemeanor. Does not modify the felony penalties for acts that include intimidating the public, affecting government conduct, or affecting the use of any building or public carrier. MODIFIES the elements of the offense of engaging in conduct that causes action by an emergency response agency. [FN: Will not materially impact the state budget.]

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GOV SIGNED Provides and amends definitions. Provides that a chief administrative officer may order a person to leave property that is owned, operated, or controlled by an institution of higher education if the person: acts or intends to do certain things; or is reckless as to whether the person's actions will cause fear for the safety of another. Provides that a person is guilty of criminal trespass upon an institution of higher education if the person: enters or remains on property that is owned, operated, or controlled by an institution of higher education after being ordered to leave; or enters or remains without authorization upon property that is owned, operated, or controlled by an institution of higher education if notice against entry or remaining has been given. Provides that the mere carrying or possession of a firearm does not warrant an order to leave IF THE person carrying or possessing the firearm is otherwise complying with all state laws regulating the possession and use of a firearm. Repeals certain provisions relating to interfering or intending to interfere with campus activities, violating rules and regulations of the institution, and failing to leave when ordered. GOV SIGNED Clarifies that the elements of the offense of enticing a minor do not include intent to complete a sexual offense with a minor. Modifies the definition of "text messaging." Provides that the penalties for enticing a minor are based on the level of sexual conduct the actor solicits, seduces, lures, or entices, or attempts to solicit, seduce, lure, or entice a minor to engage in. [FN: Will not materially impact the state budget.]

GOV SIGNED AMENDED Creates a process to expunge drug-related offenses by adding another felony and misdemeanor offense to the list of those that can be expunged. Requires the petitioner to be free of illegal substance abuse and successfully managing any substance addiction. Clarifies the difference between a pardon and expungement. A PERSON who receives an order SHALL pay a processing fee to the bureau. [FN: Will generate about \$1,000 in ongoing application/processing fee revenue and costs to the DPS beginning in FY2014. About 20 individuals who apply annually for expungement of offenses will pay \$50 each for a total of \$1,000.]

GOV SIGNED AMENDED THIS part is not related to marriage. Provides for the issuance, modification, and enforcement of protective orders between parties who are, or who have been, in a dating relationship when: the parties are emancipated or 18 years of age or older; the parties are, or have been, in a dating relationship with each other; and a party commits abuse or dating violence against the other party. Describes the restrictions that a court may include in a protective order. Describes the conditions that may be placed on an alleged perpetrator of dating violence in a protective order. [FN: Will cost the Courts \$124,200 ongoing from the Gen Fund beginning in FY2014 for judge and court clerk time. Provisions of the bill will also cost the

GOV SIGNED Permits licensed mental health therapists and substance use disorder counselors to offer therapy remotely via Internet, telephone, or other electronic means under existing authority of the Division of Occupational and Professional Licensing (DOPL). Grants rulemaking authority to DOPL relating to the method that mental health professional or psychologist license applicants may complete training hours. Provides that individuals licensed and in good standing to practice remote mental health therapy or substance use disorder counseling in other jurisdictions may provide short term transitional remote mental health therapy or remote substance use disorder counseling to clients or patients relocating to the state of Utah. [FN: Will not materially impact the state budget.]

GOV SIGNED Requires the Division of Substance Abuse and Mental Health (DSAMH) to promote integrated programs that address an individual's substance abuse, mental health, and physical healthcare needs. Requires local substance abuse and mental health authorities to cooperate with the DSAMH in promoting the aforementioned programs. Requires the DSAMH to evaluate the effectiveness of integrated health programs. Requires the DSAMH to review and approve each local substance abuse and mental health authority's plan to ensure that services result in improved overall health and functioning. Repeals language referring to the state board of substance abuse and mental health. [FN: Will not materially impact the state budget.]

GOV VETOED. Provides an exemption for a person, who is 21 years of age or older and who may lawfully possess a firearm, from certain criminal provisions related to the carrying of an unloaded concealed firearm. [FN: May reduce the total amount of dedicated credit and other fee revenue and associated costs for concealed weapons permits to the Department of Public Safety - Bureau of Criminal Identification program due to fewer Utah citizen applications; however the amount is unknown at this time. Total estimated fee revenue (\$46/application) relating to provisions in this bill for Utah citizen applicants totaled about \$932,000. Total estimated costs (\$30/application) were about \$602,000. To the extent that fewer Utah citizens apply for concealed weapons permits, the Department of Public Safety will have a net revenue loss of about \$16 per application. To the extent that expected applicants no longer apply for a concealed weapons permit as a result of this bill, they will save \$46 per application.]

PROVIDES that the court may impose a lesser sentence to be in the interests of justice and states its reasons on the record. [FN: Will not materially impact the state budget.]

GOV SIGNED AMENDED Modifies provisions regarding financial assistance to a person found to have been wrongfully convicted, to provide that if the person dies, the financial assistance payment shall be paid to the person's surviving spouse IF THE spouse was married to the person from the time of the conviction until the person's death. Provides that if the spouse has caused the death of the person by the commission of a disqualifying homicide, the survivor forfeits all right to payments. [FN: Could expand the number of factual innocence payment recipients to include spouses of those petitioners who are found factually innocent after their death. To date, factual innocence costs in Utah have ranged from \$70,000 to \$500,000 per case.]

GOV SIGNED Defines serious bodily injury. Provides that if a person has received a citation for a moving traffic violation that resulted in a collision and any person involved in the collision sustained serious bodily injury or death as a proximate result of the collision, a court may not accept a plea of guilty or no contest to a charge for the moving traffic violation unless the prosecutor agrees to the plea. Requires a peace officer that issues a citation for a moving traffic violation to record on the citation whether the moving traffic violation resulted in a collision in which any person involved in the collision sustained serious bodily injury or death as a proximate result of the traffic collision. [FN: Will not materially impact the state budget.]

GOV SIGNED Increases the penalties for arson offenses by one degree for a second or subsequent arson offense committed within 10 years after a prior arson conviction. [FN: will cost the Courts \$4,300 ongoing from the Gen Fund beginning in FY2014 for increased caseloads. They will also collect about \$2,800 Gen Fund revenue from fines. If an offender is sentenced to state prison as a result of this bill, it will cost the Dept of Corrections about \$28,000 per year per prisoner however the number of prisoners is indeterminable. Beginning in FY2024 the amount of offenders processed by the Courts may decrease as a result of this bill, however the number is unknown at this time. About 14 offenders will pay about \$200 per case in fines for a total of \$2,800 annually.]

GOV SIGNED AMENDED Prohibits a person younger than 18 years of age from using a wireless telephone to communicate with another person while operating a motor vehicle. Provides affirmative defenses to the wireless telephone prohibition. Specifies a penalty for violating the wireless telephone prohibition (infraction with FINE up to \$25). Provides that a violation of the wireless telephone prohibition is not a reportable violation. Prohibits Driver License Division from assessing points against a person's driving record for being convicted of violating the wireless telephone prohibition. [FN: Will result in a \$1,200 per year net increase in ongoing Gen Fund revenue beginning in FY2014. Will cost the Courts \$4,000 per year from the Gen Fund. Will also generate about \$5,200 per year in new Gen Fund revenue. Will annually generate about \$88,800 in revenue for local governments. About 2,765 violators will pay about \$34 on average for a total of \$94,000 (\$5,200 to the State and \$88,800 to local governments).

GOV SIGNED Provides that mobile telecommunications services shall provide call location information to law enforcement agencies and public safety communications centers in cases of emergency. Authorizes the mobile telecommunications services to establish request procedures. Provides that a mobile telecommunications service is not civilly liable for providing information in good faith. [FN: Will not materially impact the state budget.]

GOV SIGNED Provides for a juvenile court judge to consider a minor's prior adjudications in juvenile court, a minor's best interest, and the public's safety when determining a jurisdiction transfer from a juvenile court to a district court. [FN: will cost the Div of Juvenile Justice Services \$244,800 ongoing from the Gen Fund for additional serious youth offender placements beginning in FY2014 accompanied by an additional \$800 in associated costs funded with federal funds. Enactment of this bill will save the Div of Finance \$32,900 and the Dept of Corrections \$5,100 ongoing from the Gen Fund for additional serious youth offender placements not taking place in the adult system beginning in FY2014. Enactment of this bill will cost the Div of Juvenile Justice Services \$367,200 ongoing from the Gen Fund for additional serious youth offender placements in FY2015 accompanied by an additional \$1,200 in associated costs funded with federal funds. Enactment of this bill will save the the Div of Finance \$49,200 and the Dept of Corrections \$7,700 ongoing from the Gen Fund for additional serious youth offender placements not taking place in the adult system in FY2015. The allocation to counties under the jail reimbursement program may change under this bill beginning in FY2015.]

Comments:

GOV SIGNED AMENDED Increases the penalty for violations by sellers regarding regulated metal. Provides increased penalties for repeat violations of the Regulation of Metal Dealers Act by dealers and sellers. Clarifies that county and municipal governmental entities may deny or revoke licenses or other regulatory permits upon violation of the Regulation of Metal Dealers Act. Clarifies that persons who violate this act may also be charged with other offenses related to the illegal possession or sale of stolen regulated metal. Requires that dealers obtain a photograph and signature from repeat sellers at each transaction. Provides that all metal dealer transactions are subject to the Regulation of Metal Dealers Act by removing the exemption for small amounts of metal. Relocates and renumbers the Regulation of Metal Dealers Act. Relocates market discrimination and antitrust provisions currently in this part into separate parts. Makes related amendments to cross references. [FN: Will not materially impact the state budget.]

Comments:

Affirms that it is the exclusive authority of the state Legislature to adopt and enact any and all laws, orders, rules, or regulations regarding the manufacture, transfer, possession, ownership, and use of firearms exclusively within this state. Provides that state officials and employees may not enforce, or be compelled to enforce, federal regulations related to firearms. Provides that federal officials may not enforce contrary federal regulations related to intrastate firearm activity. [FN: The Legislative General Counsel has attached a Constitutional Note to this bill. If provisions in the bill are challenged in court, there will be costs associated with defending those provisions.]

Requires an operator of a motor vehicle auction, for a vehicle with a salvage certificate purchased at a motor vehicle auction, to electronically apply for a salvage certificate of title and provide evidence of compliance with certain requirements. Provides penalties for the knowing or intentional concealment, removal, destruction, or alteration of a disclosure statement or of a branded certificate of title. Addresses the powers and duties of the commission. Creates the Alcoholic Beverage Control Act Legal Fund and deposits certain penalties into the fund. Amends operational requirements for package agencies. Imposes minimum mandatory penalties related to minors. Modifies where certain fines are deposited. Expands retail licenses eligible for conditional retail licenses and allows for a three-month extension of the period of a conditional retail license.
