GOVERNOR SIGNED Provides that a person who reports a person's overdose from a controlled substance or other substance may claim an affirmative defense to specified charges of violating the Utah Controlled Substances Act if the person remains with the person who is subject to the overdose and cooperates with responding medical providers and law enforcement officers. Provides that remaining with a person subject to an overdose and cooperating with medical providers and law enforcement is a mitigating factor when determining the penalty for a related violation of the Utah Controlled Substances Act. [FN: Will not impact the state budget.]

GOVERNOR SIGNED Requires the Driver License Division to shorten a person's one- or two-year license suspension or denial period that is currently in effect for certain alcohol related offenses to a six-month period if: the driver was under the age of 19 at the time of arrest; the offense was a first offense that was committed prior to May 14, 2013; and the suspension or denial was based on the same occurrence upon which certain written verifications are based. Grants the Driver License Division rulemaking authority to make rules establishing requirements for acceptable documentation to shorten a person's driver license suspension or denial period in certain circumstances. Requires a person to pay the license reinstatement fees if a person's license sanction is shortened. [FN: Will not materially impact the state budget.]

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GOVERNOR SIGNED AMENDED Requires a document sponsor who submits a nonconsensual common law document to the county recorder for recording to: cause the sheriff to serve notice of the recording on each affected person; and initiate a judicial proceeding to determine whether the nonconsensual common law document is enforceable. Provides that a document sponsor who submits an unenforceable nonconsensual common law document to the county recorder for recording is liable to each affected person for any actual damages. Provides that a recorded nonconsensual common law document is void if the document sponsor does not comply with the requirements described in this bill. Adds the nonconsensual common law document definition to UCA 76-6-503.5. [FN: Will not impact the state budget.]

GOVERNOR SIGNED Provides that the operator of a marked authorized emergency vehicle owes no duty of care to a person who is: a suspect in the commission of a crime and evading, fleeing, or otherwise attempting to elude the operator of a marked authorized emergency vehicle; or in a motor vehicle with the suspect, unless it is proven by a preponderance of the evidence that the person's presence in the motor vehicle was involuntary and the person's participation in evading, fleeing, or attempting to elude was involuntary. Provides that an operator of a marked authorized emergency vehicle may be held liable for a fleeing suspect's injuries in certain circumstances. Provides that if an operator of a marked authorized emergency vehicle complies with certain requirements while operating the marked authorized emergency vehicle, the operator shall be deemed to have met the operator's duty to act as a reasonably prudent emergency vehicle operator under the circumstances. Requires a school district or charter school to develop a policy related to school employee intervention measures on or before September 1, 2014. Allows school personnel, agent, OR SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER to ask a student questions related to youth suicide prevention, intervention, or postvention as part of the school's suicide prevention program. Imposes ineligibility conditions. Requires the creation of a deferred deposit database. Addresses query procedures. [FN: Could increase examination time by 1,200 hours industry wide for the Depart. of Financial Institutions. Beginning FY 2015, this increase in examination time could produce revenue to the Gen Fund Restricted - Financial Institutions Account by \$66,000. The cost of this bill for FY 2015 could be \$89,000, equal to 3/4 FTE for one year and start-up costs. The ongoing cost of this bill could be \$113,400, equal to 1 FTE for one year. Would require deferred deposit lenders to pay a fee, up to \$1, for each query of the deferred deposit database authorized in this bill. Deferred deposit lenders could see an increase in fees payable to the Depart of Financial Institutions for increased examination time charged to them. Beginning FY 2015, this increase could be \$66,000 industry-wide. The individual cost is commensurate with the number of hours per examination, multiplied by \$55 per hour as outlined in statute.]

Describes signature requirements and provides a process for a voter to remove the voter's signature from a petition. Describes the signatures that are required, together with other requirements, to qualify for a recall election to be held. Describes the process for submission and review of recall election packets. Describes duties of the lieutenant governor and county clerks with respect to a recall election petition. Establishes an appeals process if the lieutenant governor determines that a recall election petition is insufficient. Describes circumstances under which a recall election may not be held. Describes the ballot and election date of a recall election. Provides for removal from office of an executive branch elected official who is recalled. Describes unlawful conduct in relation to provisions of this bill. Makes passage of this bill contingent upon passage of an enabling amendment to the Utah Constitution. In the first two fiscal years, federal funding will cover these cost increases and save the State General Fund \$2,300,000 in FY 2015 and \$5,100,000 in FY 2016. By FY 2021 the bill's General Fund cost could be an estimated \$25 million. The bill could also reduce the Education Fund's cost share by \$100,000 in FY 2015 and \$200,000 ongoing beginning in FY 2015. Finally, the bill could reduce the cost share born by restricted funds by \$250,000 in FY 2015 and \$500,000 ongoing beginning in FY 2016. Local government mental health and substance abuse services could be replaced for 2,200 individuals with full Medicaid coverage at a higher federal match rate which generates General Fund savings of about \$400,000 one-time in FY 2015 and \$800,000 for FY 2016. These savings then could decline annually beginning in FY 2017 to about \$500,000 by FY 2021. County governments could also see savings for newly eligible inmates for Medicaid to cover some inpatient hospital medical costs. Could increase by up to \$85 million for 59,800 individuals in FY 2015 and spending could increase to \$300 million for 70,300 people by FY 2021.]
