<b>Agenda Item:</b>	Welcome and Approval of Minutes – Doug Bodrero
<b>Notes:</b>	<p>Doug Bodrero welcomed everyone and introduced Jo Lynn Kruse and Marvin Dodge. Jo Lynn is the new executive secretary at CCJJ and Marvin has transferred to the USAAV Coordinator position at CCJJ.</p> <p>Mike Sibbett made a <b>motion</b> to approve the June 22, 2000 minutes. Second: Pete Haun. The <b>motion was unanimously approved.</b></p>

<b>Agenda Item:</b>	JAIBG PLAN - Susan Burke
<b>Notes:</b>	<p>Susan distributed a handout showing the fund allocations for JAIBG 1998 and 1999 <u>and a draft allocation</u> for 2000. She reported that \$132,500 of the administrative budget has not been used and the 1998 money will lapse <u>on January 31, 2001.</u></p>

<b>Agenda Item:</b>	CRIME REDUCTION PLAN - Mike Haddon
Notes:	<p>Mike reported on the Chiefs of Police meeting indicating that their focus for the next couple of years will be drugs and related crimes identified in the Crime Reduction Plan, more particularly meth and date rape drugs. He also indicated that a second survey will be sent to law enforcement agencies to be completed on a voluntary basis.</p> <p>Legislators appear to have little knowledge of the Crime Reduction Plan. It has been suggested that we work through President Hillyard and Representative Stephens, possibly inviting them to the CCJJ Annual Meeting and asking for time to present to the caucuses.</p> <p>Phase II of the Crime Reduction Plan will be discussed at the annual meeting.</p>

<b>Agenda Item:</b>	METH ISSUES - Camille Anthony & Marvin Dodge
Notes:	<p>Camille indicated the Cabinet will be discussing meth issues in state government. It is the intention to educate the legislature on the wide use of meth and issues surrounding the making, using and distribution of the drug. It was suggested to bring personal stories to the legislature.</p>

<b>Agenda Item:</b>	MENTAL RETARDATION SUBCOMMITTEE - Dave Walsh
Notes:	<p>Dave requested the Commission consider extending the MOU with the Mental Retardation subcommittee for one additional year. He indicated the subcommittee's need to work through issues and the need for additional time to cross educate. Sue Behle indicated that the Governor's Commission on People with Disabilities has provided a grant to help law enforcement assess whether someone is mentally handicapped. They will also focus on training the trainers of law enforcement and developing an instrument to aid officers in determining if someone is mentally disabled. CCJJ may be able to provide grant funding to assist.</p> <p>Pete Haun made a <b>motion</b> to extend the subcommittee for an additional year. Second: Georgia Block The <b>motion was unanimously approved.</b></p>

<b>Agenda Item:</b>	GRANT MANAGEMENT - Camille Anthony
Notes:	Camille discussed the Grant Allocation handout. She explained the reorganization with grant managers based on subject matter rather than funding source. This reorganization will help to facilitate reporting requirements and monitoring.

<b>Agenda Item:</b>	CCJJ ANNUAL MEETING - Camille Anthony
Notes:	<p>The annual meeting is scheduled for Friday, September 22, 2000. An agenda and location information will be sent to each member.</p> <p>The preliminary agenda will include: meth issues, Crime Reduction Plan Phase II, statutory changes for USAAV, subcommittee reports, and the Juvenile Justice Subcommittee will provide feed back on expectations.</p>

<b>Agenda Item:</b>	BUDGET PROCESS - Dave Walsh
Notes:	Dave indicated the budget process will be similar to last year. Any proposal for new programs will need to give up an old program in exchange. Budgets from agencies are due by September 15.

<b>Agenda Item:</b>	OTHER
Notes:	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Rick Schwermer reported that \$1.3 million out of the tobacco settlement funds are targeted to drug courts. Currently we have 16 drug courts. Weber was the only jurisdiction to receive federal money.</li> <li>2. Salt Lake County Crime Reduction Conference will be held at the new Hilton Hotel, on October 31, 2000.</li> </ol>
