<b>Agenda Item:</b>	<b>WELCOME AND APPROVAL OF MINUTES – DOUG BODRERO</b>
<b>Notes:</b>	<p>Chair Doug Bodrero welcomed everyone and reminded the Commission to return their signed per diem form (even if they are not eligible to collect per diem).</p> <p>Mike Sibbett made a <b>motion</b> to approve the January 24, 2001 minutes. Second: Georgia Block. <b>The motion was unanimously approved.</b></p>

<b>Agenda Item:</b>	<b>VICTIMIZATION SURVEY – MIKE HADDON</b>
<b>Notes:</b>	<p>Mike Haddon distributed copies of the Victim Survey and provided an update. To date, 5,000 pre-survey cards, 5,000 surveys, 2,000 follow up cards and 2,000 surveys have been mailed. Approximately 2,000 surveys (40%) have been completed and returned. This is an exceptional return rate to date.</p>

<b>Agenda Item:</b>	<b>LEGISLATION/BUDGET – CAMILLE ANTHONY, RON GORDON</b>
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<b>Notes:</b>	<p>Ron Gordon distributed a summary of legislation prepared for law enforcement proving a brief description of legislative bills passed that will have an impact on law enforcement. Also distributed was a summary for Commission members on relevant legislation that passed.</p> <p>Camille Anthony informed the Commission that CCJJ is up for sunset review during the 2002 Legislature. Legislation will be required.</p> <p>Camille provided a brief review of the budget. The extradition budget was restored with its supplemental and with full restoration for FY 01-02.</p> <p>It is anticipated a special session will be called in June.</p> <p>On the national front, Congress eliminated discretionary money for Byrne; 25% cut in COPS program; cuts in VOITIS. Don't look for any increase in federal money/grants, etc. Doug Bodrero advised agencies to watch projections with department budgets regarding federal grant monies.</p> <p>Bill Dinehart is retiring the end of the month. Gary Dalton suggested CCJJ recognize his contribution.</p>
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<b>Agenda Item:</b>	<b>CRIMINAL AND JUVENILE JUSTICE RESEARCH CONSORTIUM – CAMILLE ANTHONY and RUSS VAN VLEET</b>
<b>Notes:</b>	<p>Camille reported the Executive Committee approved \$10,000 from the crime reduction funds for computers for the Justice Consortium. The Bireley Foundation has committed \$300,000 towards this project, with the UofU as the fiscal agent. The money will be used for staff and research assistants. The Deans have shown great interest in this consortium.</p>
