Welcome – Welcome by Brant Johnson

An award was presented to Jennifer Hemenway by Chief Rich Hendricks of the Logan City Police Department for help in expanding their information technology (IT) to include a regional area.

FY04 Formula Grant Allocation – Susan Burke & Reg Garff

Susan gave an overview of the grant allocation recommendations.

Motion to Approve: Gary Anderson

Second: Mike Chabries

Creighton Horton expressed an AG opinion on the full amount requested for “Identity Fraud Protection.” A discussion followed in which it was stated that there is a great need for a clearinghouse. However, all other grant funding awards would need to be adjusted if this was approved.

12 affirmative and 2 opposed. Motion passed.

Reg presented an overview of the grant allocation recommendations.

Motion: Dan Becker made a motion to move the left over 2002 JAIBG funds, \$237,000, from the Community Program to the CARE Program.

Seconded by Blake Chard and unanimously approved.

Information Sharing Discussion – Jennifer Hemenway

Jennifer led off the presentation with an explanation on the MATRIX background. Ed followed explaining that he and Jennifer had been staff to this for the Governor's Office. A review committee was recommended initially to study this

issue but ultimately, Governor Walker agreed that Utah would NOT participate in the MATRIX project.

Asset Forfeiture Proposals – Ed McConkie & Ron Gordon

Ron Gordon gave an overview of the current situation on Asset Forfeiture. He stated that there is a working group being formed to forge recommendations regarding asset forfeiture and bring them before the Executive Committee in August. This group will provide procedural outlines on how to proceed under the specifics of SB 175. Discussions ensued regarding suggested lawmakers to be on the working group. Many will watch the first year very carefully and they would like recommendations from the committee regarding how to interweave treatment heavily into the formula.

Motion was made by Mike Chabries to include one sheriff from an urban area and one chief from a rural area in the working group.

Second by Reed Richards and unanimously approved.

Kay Cornaby recommended that Senator Valentine be asked to participate on the committee with Rep. Eric Hutchings as a secondary, if necessary.

Motion carried with one opposed.

Brant Johnson adjourned the meeting.
