Agenda Item	Gang Grants
Notes	<p>Reg Garff reviewed the 2011 Gang Reduction grant budget recommendation, which includes funding one grant for a total of \$156,700. The remaining funds totaling \$93,300 will be through a second RFP to municipalities implementing the OJJDP gang model.</p> <p>Motion: Greg Skordas made a motion to approve the Gang Reduction grant budget recommendation. The motion was seconded by Mark Payne and passed unanimously.</p>

Notes	<p>Reg Garff reviewed the budget recommendations for the 2007 JABG interest money, which includes funding two grants for a total of \$24,600.</p> <p>Motion: Greg Skordas made a motion to approve the budget recommendations for the 2007 JABG interest money. Agenda Item	JAG and Other Grants
Notes	<p>Richard Ziebarth reviewed the budget recommendations for the FY2010 JAG grant, FY2011 State Task Force grant, and the FY2011 State Asset Forfeiture grant.</p> <p>Motion: Greg Skordas made a motion to approve the JAG grant, State Asset Forfeiture grant, and State Task Force grant budget recommendations. The motion was seconded by Dan Maldonado and passed unanimously.</p> <p>Richard reviewed the Utah Drug and Crime Task Force Performance Outputs. He</p>

	reported approximately \$128 million in illicit drugs have been seized by Utah's drug task forces over the past five years. Richard noted there are 17 drug and crime task forces operating in 26 of Utah's 29 counties. Task Force operations include drug arrests, drug removals, anti-drug education, gang suppression, and property forfeiture. He also reported most criminal offenders become involved in property crime and violent crime to support drug habits and drug trafficking and approximately 70% to 80% of Utah's incarcerated offenders have a drug problem.
