Agenda Item	Prenatal Substance Abuse Prevalence Study
Notes	<p>Dr. Karen Buchi gave a presentation on the Prenatal Substance Abuse Prevalence Study. The objectives of the study include 1) determine the prevalence and patterns of prenatal substance use among women delivering infants, 2) try and identify the risk factors, and 3) compare it to previous studies.</p>
Agenda Item	Gang Reduction Grants
Notes	<p>Dave Walsh reported there is \$253,300 available to fund two continuation projects and program evaluation by the University of Utah Criminal Justice Center. Continuation projects were approved by CCJJ last year with the intent of providing ongoing funding for these projects for up to three years. He reviewed budget recommendations. Concerns were raised in regards to the Ogden Weber Community Partnership CROSS project. Questions raised included 1) why is the number of youth served lower than the number in the original proposal, 2) what is the re-offense rate for the participants, and 3) what risk level are the participants.</p> <p>Motion: Camille Anthony made a motion to approve the Provo Gang Project and asked staff to address the questions raised today and others they may have on the Ogden CROSS project and report to the Executive Committee for a final decision on awarding that money. The motion was seconded by Clark Harms and passed unanimously.</p>
