| Child & Family Empowerment<br><i>Polynesian Young Women's Self Esteem Group</i>                                    | 12-week self-esteem workshop giving Polynesian girls the tools to bridge the gap between their Polynesian and American traditions.   | \$40,000    | 1         |
| Children's Service Society<br><i>Grandfamilies</i>   | Expands program to Tooele Co. by providing support for children in a kinship placement. Aims to prevent substance abuse and delinquency among participating youth.   | \$40,000    | 1         |
| SL Co. Youth Services<br><i>Discovering Possibilities Program (DPP)</i>  | Serve 24-36 girls referred by JJS between ages 13 & 17 with a 12 week program. There will be 7-9 hours per week of psycho-educational curriculum (Girls' Circle), case management, mentoring and community service.  | \$55,000    | 1         |
| Colors of Success<br><i>The Dream Team</i>   | Serves 50 minority females age 12-17 in the Ogden area. Includes: life skills to instill cultural pride, case management educational recreation activities, service-learning projects & mental health services (as needed). Parents invited to attend activities modeled after the Strengthening Families Program. | \$75,000    | 1         |
| Division of Juvenile Justice Services (JJS)<br><i>Protective &amp; Risk Assessment (PRA) Enhancement for Girls</i> | Will develop a gender-specific risk assessment tool for girls to be used by juvenile court and JJS line staff.   | \$35,000    | 1         |

| Poder Para La Familia Hispana<br><i>Ocho Pasos (8 Steps to Success)</i>       | Targets affiliated and gang-involved Hispanic, male youths involved with Juvenile Court. | Administrative Office of the Courts<br><i>Truancy Mediation</i>               | Expands truancy mediation, victim offender mediation, group conferencing and talking circles, all consistent with restorative justice philosophy, to rural juvenile court districts.                           | \$42,000 | 2        |
| Lincoln Center Boys & Girls Club<br><i>Out-of-School Hours Youth Programs</i> | After-school prevention program aimed at delinquency & family conflict.  | \$26,250 | 3        |
| Big Brothers Big Sisters of Utah<br><i>BBBS Mentoring Washington Co.</i>      | Expands BBBS program to Southern Utah to provide one-on-one mentoring for Washington Co. youths.   | \$46,500 | 3        |
| Utah Peace Institute<br><i>Young Refugees of Utah</i>                         | Assists immigrant youth to transition to American society through culturally sensitive leadership building.  | \$15,000 | 3        |
| Vietnamese Volunteer Youth Association<br><i>Delinquency Prevention</i>       | Provides weekly activity and ongoing services to reduce/prevent gang & substance abuse among Vietnamese youth.   | \$22,500 | 3        |
