

Utah's 2006-2007 Title II Formula Grants

Background: These grants are funded through the Title II Formula Grant from the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention to create new and effective delinquency prevention/intervention programs. Projects may receive up to four years of declining funds.

| Juvenile Jail Removal | Juvenile Justice Services (JJS) | Funds ensure that minors are not locked up in adult facilities. Provides transportation costs. | \$19,000 | N/A |
| Kids-At-Hope | Boys & Girls Clubs of Brigham City | After-school prevention program aimed at delinquency & family conflict. | \$17,500 | 4 |
| Young Refugees of Utah | Utah Peace Institute | Develops leadership skills in immigrant youth and assists with the transition to American society. | \$10,000 | 4 |
| Vietnamese Youth Delinquency Prevention | Vietnamese Volunteer Youth Association | Gang & substance abuse prevention for Vietnamese youth through weekly activities. | \$15,000 | 4 |
| Legal Resources for Minority Youth | Legal Equity for Minority Youth | Provides improved legal resources for minority youth in the 4 th judicial district | \$40,000 | 4 |
| BBBS Mentoring Program of Washington Co. | Big Brothers Big Sisters of Utah | Mentoring program for Washington Co. youth addressing risk factors of: early initiation of alcohol use, tobacco/drug use, and low commitment to school. | \$31,000 | 4 |
| Family & Youth Connections | Colors of Success | Targets families of clients involved in substance abuse treatment in SL County. Program focus on youth 6-12 years of age. Utilizes SAMSAH approved curriculum in weekly meetings. | \$30,188 | 3 |
| Technological Literacy | Boys & Girls Clubs of Brigham City | 350 struggling students, age 11-18, improve grades, attendance and literacy levels. Gain career experience in digital applications and multimedia. Parents also receive literacy training. | \$36,557 | 3 |
| Truancy Mediation | Administrative Office of the Courts | Expands truancy mediation, victim offender mediation, group conferencing and talking circles, all consistent with restorative justice philosophy, to rural juvenile court districts. | \$28,000 | 3 |
| Ocho Pasos (8 Steps to Success) | Poder Para La Familia Hispana | Targets affiliated and gang-involved Hispanic male youth in Juvenile Court by providing classes for them and their family during the school year. Curriculum covers 8 areas of need. | \$12,375 | 3 |

| <i>SS Mentoring & Tutoring</i> | South Summit Healthy Community Coalition | Provides mentoring and tutoring services for youth 5-14 yrs. of age. Also includes life skills, creativity and physical fitness activities | \$41,464 | 3 |
| Grandfamilies | Children's Service Society | Expands program to Tooele Co. by providing support for children in kinship placements. Aims to prevent substance abuse and delinquency among participating youth and support for their guardians. | \$36,000 | 2 |
| Discovering Possibilities Program (DPP) | SL Co. Youth Services | Serve 30 girls referred by JJS Early Intervention and Juvenile Court, between ages 13 & 17 with a 12 week program. There will be 7-9 hours per week of psycho-educational curriculum (Girls' Circle), case management, mentoring and community service. | \$41,250 | 2 |
| The Dream Team | Colors of Success | Serves 50 minority females age 12-17 in the Ogden area. Includes: life skills to instill cultural pride, case management educational recreation activities, service-learning projects & mental health services (as needed). Parents invited to attend activities modeled after the Strengthening Families Program. | \$67,500 | 2 |
| Protective & Risk Assessment (PRA) Enhancement for Females | Juvenile Justice Services (JJS) | Develop a gender-specific risk assessment tool as an enhancement to PRA, for girls. Will be used by juvenile court and JJS line staff to serve about 485 girls. | \$26,250 | 2 |
| Polynesian Young Women's Self Esteem Group | Child & Family Empowerment | 12-week workshop providing Polynesian girls behavioral, thinking and communication skills to help them understand how to be true to themselves in the midst of strong cultural and family pressure. Referrals come from probation, Juvenile Justice Services, and other community organizations. | \$36,000 | 2 |

| Reconnecting Youth | Delta City | Model program serving 35-40 youth in grades 9-12 who show signs of poor school achievement. Integrates small group work and life skills training models in an after-school program. Also includes tutoring and vocational training. | \$37,800 | 2 |
| Granite Park Youth Development Project | City of South Salt Lake | Grant funds a site supervisor and support staff to coordinate program partners to implement an after school program. Activities include: Gear Up Afterschool Sports Program, Cultural Competency Training, Why Try Club, and student led service projects, social activities and initiatives. | \$47,025 | 1 |
