

2014 Utah DMC Subcommittee Accomplishments

- Continue data collection and RRI analysis
 - Completed FY13 RRI
 - Studied trends at arrest, referral, and diversion
 - Presented to stakeholders on trends
- Evaluate Diversion Assessment Report and develop intervention plan
 - Reached verbal agreement with Juvenile Court for annual update
 - Provided updates to TCEs, Probation Chiefs, and Board of Juvenile Judges
 - Juvenile court is examining the lower rate of re-diversion for minority youth
 - Utah County was featured as one of the nine jurisdictions that showed effective method in DMC diversion reduction by OJJDP
- Evaluate and develop intervention plan based on 2012 DMC Arrest and Referral Assessment
 - Formed three local working groups (Salt Lake, Utah, and Weber County)
 - Conducted strategic meetings
 - Completed DMC Best Practices Initiative report June 2014
- Market Community Relations Training to law enforcement and expand its use
 - Conducted the Connecticut's "Effective Police Interaction with Youth" Training of Trainer curriculum on Nov. 12-14, 2014
 - 7 LEAs participated
 - trained 22 individuals, and
 - Certified 14 sworn officers to teach the curriculum.
- Continue to raise DMC awareness with stakeholders
 - 11 stakeholders and 85 individuals reached
 - Audiences included:
 - Law Enforcement Agencies
 - Administrative Office of the Court: Probation Chiefs
 - School Districts: Salt Lake City, Granite, and Jordan
 - Policy Maker Org.: UBJJ, CCJJ, and Legislators
 - Community: CODA Law Enforcement Subcommittee
- Collaborated with Salt Lake County Council on Diversity Affairs (CODA) Law Enforcement Subcommittee :
 - Conducted community forum on positive interaction with law enforcement officers (Mexican Consulate and Vietnamese Community of Utah)
